What is Medicare?

Medicare is the federal health insurance program for qualified Americans aged 65 and older. Some people under 65 may also be eligible under certain health conditions, such as End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD).

This program offering is called 'Original Medicare.' You can enroll in Original Medicare (Part A & Part B) by contacting the Social Security Office.

Original Medicare

PART A: is your Hospital Insurance. It helps cover hospital care, skilled nursing facility care, nursing home care, hospice, and home health services.

PART B: is your Medical Insurance. It helps cover ambulance services, inpatient and outpatient mental health, clinical research, getting a second opinion before surgery, and durable medical equipment (like crutches).
